**Apr 7: Harcourt Communal Garden Planning Meeting** We are entering the ninth growing season for the Harcourt Communal Garden. We have harvested almost 4,800 lbs of organically-grown vegetables, herbs and fruit for donation to CCSC food pantry in downtown Guelph. This delicious, local produce helps to feed some of our community's most food-insecure folks. The garden is fully maintained by volunteers from planting in early June until the end of the harvest season in October. Teams of four work together for about two hours/week. Each team is scheduled, on average, 6 to 7 times throughout the season. No expertise in vegetable gardening is required as we have many veteran growers on the team who are wonderful mentors.
